We open our 2018 season with a young quartet which is fast gaining a reputation for imaginative and communicative performances. Eusebius were the resident string quartet at the Lewes Chamber Music Festival in 2016 and 2017, at the Wye Valley chamber music festival in 2017 and at FitzFest, Fitzrovia's newest music festival. They have appeared at numerous London venues including St James' Piccadilly, the Foundling Museum, Blackheath Halls and venues across the country.

The Eusebius Quartet have twice performed live on BBC Radio 3's *In Tune*: last year in connection with their Bloomsbury Foundling School project and earlier this year before their Conway Hall debut.

Having met as students these outstanding young musicians have been very excited to reunite as a quartet after completing studies in London, New York, Helsinki, Paris and the Netherlands.

Her recordings include a highly acclaimed CD of Liszt's Transcendental Études (selections of which she is playing in this concert) and a recording of Chopin's second piano sonata commissioned by Poland's National Chopin Institute.
